Emergency

An emergency is where the police are needed immediately. This can be when a crime is in progress or when somebody and/or their property are in immediate danger. For deaf people in the event of an emergency, you can contact us by calling **01522 558263** or **558140** or via mobile/text **07761 911287**. Non-emergency

Use this number if you need to contact the police for an incident that is not an emergency - for example, if your car has been broken into whilst you have been shopping. You should also use this number for all internal departments or general enquiries.

Crimestoppers

If you have any information about crime, call Crimestoppers anonymously. Crimestoppers is a registered charity, independent of the police. Crimestoppers is only interested in what you know, not who you are. You won't be asked your name and your calls will not be recorded.

IN YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD...

Against a background of challenging budget cuts and with Government proposals for reform coming thick and fast, this report outlines the way in which the Force and the Authority have continued to develop and improve services.

We are confident about the future of policing in Lincolnshire. We have placed ourselves in the best possible position to meet the challenges of change and to ensure that our priorities - protecting the public, improving our services and making communities safer - are kept at the forefront of everything we do.

We know through extensive consultation that the people of Lincolnshire believe our priorities should be centred on neighbourhood policing. Last year we started the process of simplifying the Force structure to meet budgetary challenges and maintain service levels and those changes are being developed further and implemented this year. Change isn't always comfortable but we are confident that the proposals will allow more officers to be allocated to Neighbourhood Policing Teams without compromising our ability to provide a wide range of other less

visible but crucial services. In addition, Lincolnshire County Council continues to provide support with its investment in Police Community Support Officers.

After several years of being disadvantaged by the Government's funding formula we are used to delivering the best value for every pound of public money. As a consequence we have been able to make critical investments in areas such as major crime, serious and organised crime, and the protection of the most vulnerable in our communities.

Long-term operations such as Fusion, which tackles serious crime and Nova, which is aimed at dealing with violence and abuse, continue to contribute to reductions in offences across Lincolnshire.

Latest performance figures, which present only a limited snapshot of the work of the Force, show that overall recorded crime in the county has been reduced and that the rate of reduction has exceeded the national average in almost every category.

However we are confident that by continuing to examine all potential options for changing work practices and the way in which we deliver services, we can do more.

The past year has been one of the more difficult that Forces and Authorities have had to face. In Lincolnshire we were well prepared for the challenges. The actions we have taken and which we will continue to develop and refine, will ensure that Lincolnshire remains one of the safest counties in which to live.

We will, in short, continue to police with PRIDE - Professionalism, Respect, Integrity, Dedication and Empathy.
